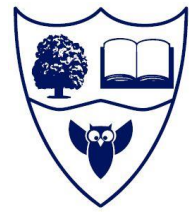

Dear Parents/ Carers,

PTA Disco and non-uniform – it is the PTA disco and non-uniform day this Thursday. Children may come to school in non-uniform in exchange for any boxed/ sealed chocolate for our Christmas Fair.

Tickets for the disco will be available on ParentPay until tomorrow. On Thursday evening, entry to the disco will be through the main office at 4.30pm for KS1 and 5.45pm for KS2. **Children must bring their ticket to the disco with them** as this will be our way of knowing who is in the building for safety reasons.

Please ensure you collect your child on time from the office at 5.30pm from the KS1 disco and 6.45pm from the KS2 disco. Children will not be allowed to walk home alone after the disco.

If your child is attending Owlets on Thursday and they also have a ticket for the disco, please ensure you complete a form available from Owlets to give permission for your child to attend the disco.

Teddy Donations – Thank you to everyone who has already sent in teddy donations for our Adopt a Teddy stall at the Christmas Fair. If you are sorting at home over half term and have any more teddies, then please send them into school. Thank you.

Cross-Country Tournament – some of our KS2 children took part in a local cross country tournament at Lum Head Primary School last week. 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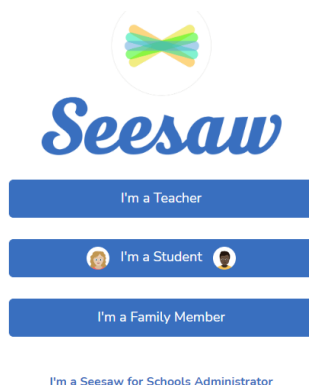
Seesaw Homework – as a parent/ carer it is advisable to have the Seesaw Family app on your phone to keep up to date with communication across school. However, there



is no need for the children to have an app for Seesaw. When children need to complete their homework they only need access to the internet.

Instructions to complete homework on Seesaw

1. Visit <https://web.seesaw.me/>
2. Go to log in in the top right corner
3. The following screen will appear



4. Choose 'I am a Student'
5. You will then see the screen below. The only part your child needs to complete is the TEXT CODE or scan the QR code. They don't need to complete any other information on the screen.

6. If you have more than one child needing to complete their homework, then they can complete this at the same time as their sibling on a different device. If children are sharing a device, then if one child logs out, the other child should be able to log in to their class Seesaw activities using their own code.
7. We have a homework club every Monday lunchtime for any children struggling to access a device at home.
8. Please ensure that you keep your child's code safe.
